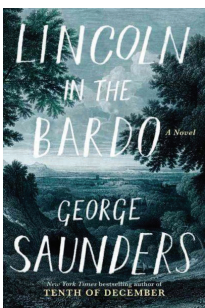

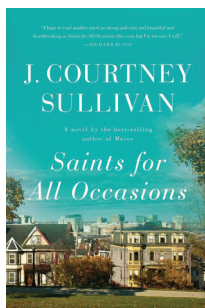
SUMMER READING

Novelist Plus is a database that has helped readers connect with books for over 20 years. Type in a little information and you will be provided

with readalikes for your favorite book or author. You can also search for "listen-alikes" for your favorite audio books. There are lists of genres to browse as well as books listed by "appeal factors" such as Character, Storyline or Writing Style.

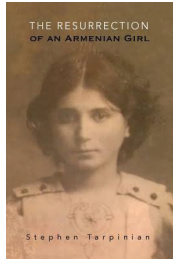

FRIDAY NIGHT DIALOGUES

Friday, August 4th, 7:00pm: *The Resurrection of an Armenian Girl*

Shelter Islander Richard Tarpinian will discuss his late son Stephen's book, *The Resurrection of an Armenian Girl*. It is the dramatic true story of his grandmother Helen Tarpinian's survival of the 1915 Armenian genocide which claimed more than one million lives. Free copies of the book will be available. Donations will go to the Stephen Tarpinian Memorial Fund which provides grants and scholarships to high school swimmers, bikers or runners.

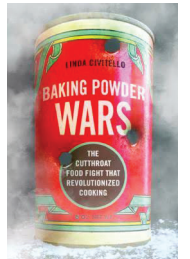


Friday, August 18th, 7:00pm: *Collision Course: The Vatican, The Nuns of America and the Meaning of Obedience*

Dr. Carol Galligan will discuss her upcoming book which covers recent conflicts between the Vatican and the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR) which is based on hours of extensive interviews with all the major figures in the LCWR.

Friday, August 25th, 7:00pm: *Baking Powder Wars*

This program is co-sponsored with the Sylvester Manor Educational Farm. Linda Civitello, speaker, writer and historian, will talk about her book *Baking Powder Wars: The Cutthroat Food Fight that Revolutionized Cooking*. Commercially successful baking powder was created in 1854 by Eben Horsford, who started the Shelter Island Library and was a summer resident of Sylvester Manor. By the end of the 19th century, the baking powder industry was worth millions of dollars. Civitello's book has dramatic stories of battling brands, lawsuits, bribery and competing formulas.

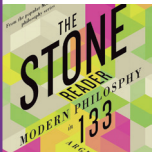

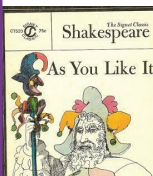

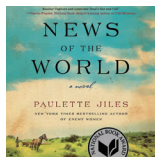
ETCHED WATER BOTTLE CRAFT

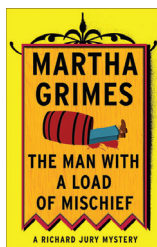

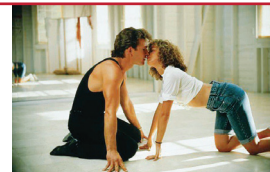
