COFFEE AND COLORING FOR ADULTS

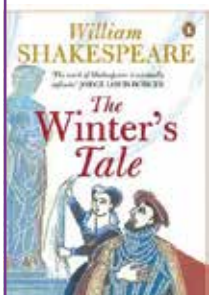
Saturday, January 13th, 1:00pm

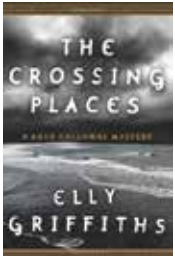


SHELTER ISLAND LIBRARY BOOK CLUB:
