The popular on-demand film streaming service Kanopy is now available for free at Shelter Island Public Library. Library card holders can access Kanopy and sign up to start streaming films instantly by visiting http://silibrary.kanopy.com. Films can be streamed from any computer, television, mobile device or platform by downloading the Kanopy app for iOS, Android, AppleTV, Chromecast or Roku.

Offering what the New York Times calls "a garden of cinematic delights," Kanopy showcases more than 30,000 of the world's best films, including awardwinning documentaries, rare and hard-to-find titles, film festival favorites, indie and classic films, and world cinema with collections from Kino Lorber, Music Box Films, Samuel Goldwyn, The Orchard, The Great Courses, PBS and thousands of independent filmmakers.

With the motto of "thoughtful entertainment," Kanopy provides Shelter Island Library patrons with access to films of unique social and cultural value; films that are often difficult or impossible to access elsewhere, and programming that features diversity, with a wide array of kanopy foreign language films.


ADULT PROGRAMS




Thursday, May 17th, 5:30pm




SHELTER ISLAND LIBRARY BOOK CLUB:
