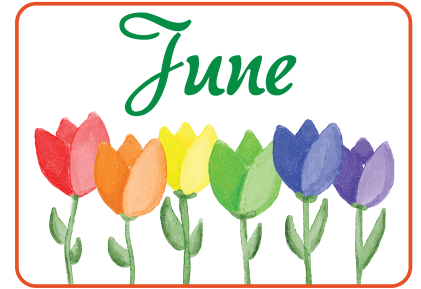

## FRIDAY NIGHT DIALOGUES

Friday, June 1st, 7:00pm

**John Kerr: *Dreamers Before the Mast - The History of the Tall Ship Regina Maris* [SL300]**

The tall ship *Regina Maris*, built in 1908, had several adventures and incarnations - carrying cargo in the Baltic Sea, rounding Cape Horn, cruising French Polynesia, surviving two hurricanes, and serving as an oceanographic research vessel. John Kerr, who crewed on the ship, will recount the epic story of the *Regina Maris* and the people who built, owned and loved her as told in his detailed and well documented book.

**Isabel Vincent: *Dinner with Edward - A Story of an Unexpected Friendship* [SL300]**

Journalist Isabel Vincent was living in New York City, enduring a foundering marriage. A friend asked Vincent to look in on her 93 year old, recently widowed father, Edward. They began to meet for weekly dinners prepared by Edward - an excellent chef. *Dinner with Edward* chronicles their deepening friendship over delicious meals and the influence the life-affirming Edward had on Vincent. Ms. Vincent will be here to talk about the book and the upcoming film adaptation. You are sure to be touched by this memoir. ***Fake News: How to Identify Alternative Facts in a Post-Truth World* [SL303]**

Julia Brennan will lead a discussion with a panel of distinguished journalists about what fake news is, why it spreads, and how we can be media literate in a post-truth world.

## COFFEE AND COLORING FOR ADULTS

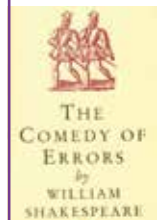

## GREAT DECISIONS: RUSSIA'S FOREIGN POLICY

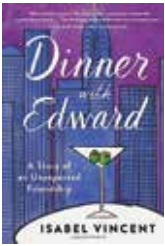
Thursday, June 14th, 5:30pm. [SL301]

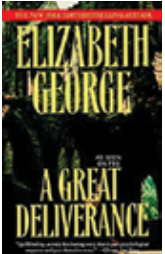


### SHELTER ISLAND LIBRARY BOOK CLUB:

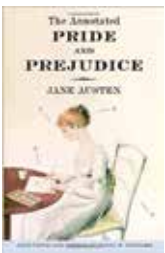
*A Great Deliverance* by Elizabeth George
