New Yorkers for Clean Power

New Yorkers for Clean Power (NYCP) is a statewide collaborative campaign to rapidly shift to a clean energy economy. NYCP is focused on advancing solar, wind, energy efficiency, electric vehicles, renewable heating and cooling, as well as creating jobs in these industries for all communities in New York. Dr. Thomas Roush, Trustee of The Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) and Co-Founder of NYCP will be joined by Betta Broad (Outreach Director, NYCP), Gordian Raacke (Executive Director, Renewable Energy Long Island) and Linda B. James (Town of East Hampton Energy Sustainability Committee Chair) for a presentation on their work, current initiatives and the future of clean power in our state. Come and learn! Carol Galligan, Ph.D.: Collision Course: The Vatican, the Nuns of America and the Meaning of Obedience Collision Course, Carol Galligan's extensively researched book, details the 2012 to 2014 conflict between the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR), a group which includes 80 percent of nuns in America, and the Vatican. The Vatican reprimanded the nuns for straying from Catholic doctrine and put the LCWR under the control of an archbishop. Galligan's book includes a timeline of relevant events in the conflict as well as interviews with nuns. She'll share with us this fascinating account of dissent that was viewed by the Vatican as defiance.

Andrew Flescher, Ph.D.: Would Legalizing the Sale of Organs Reduce the Organ Shortage in America?

Nearly 120,000 people are in need of healthy organs in the United States. Every ten minutes a new name is added to the list while an average of twenty people die each day waiting for an available organ. Some surgeons and policy experts advocate for the legalization of organ sales. In his book, The Organ Shortage Crisis in America: Incentives, Civic Duty and Closing the Gap Professor Andrew Flescher of Stony Brook University argues against this approach, drawing on the fields of moral psychology and economics as well as scores of interviews with living donors. He'll present both sides of the issue as well as looking at alternative solutions to this crisis.

"Cannery Row in Monterey in California is a poem, a stink, a grating noise, a quality of light, a tone, a habit, a nostalgia, a dream." John Steinbeck's novel, set during the Great Depression, revolves around the people living on a street lined with sardine canneries: Lee Chong, the local grocer; Doc, a marine biologist; and Mack, the leader of a group of derelicts. The novel unfolds in a series of vignettes exploring the themes of camaraderie, nostalgia and appreciating people beyond first appearances.



MYSTERY MONDAY BOOK CLUB:

This standout first novel introduces dauntless private investigator Aimee Leduc. When Aimee arrives at the home of Lili Stein to present the photo, however, she finds the woman dead, a swastika carved into her forehead.

War Journal: The Incredible World War II Escape of Major Damon "Rocky" Gause

In honor of Veteran's Day, join us for the true story of one of the most incredible escapes in all of World War II. Two Americans, Damon Gause and William Lloyd Osborne, escapees of Bataan, sailed, in 1942, in a leaky fishing boat, from the Philippines to Australia. They faced typhoons, constant threats from Japanese ships, submarines and airplanes, lack of water and food and even a visit to the world's largest leper colony. Their treacherous journey is recorded in journals they kept and photographs they took during their ordeal which gives us access to their thoughts and emotions.


