SAVING AT THE LIBRARY

If one of your New Year's resolutions is to become a bit more frugal, we are here to help. You may know that we check out books and movies, but we also have many resources that may help you keep a few more dollars in your wallet. For example:

Flipster - This resource provides access to your many favorite magazines from a variety of publishers via a web browser or a custom app made specifically for iPads, Android tablets and Kindle Fire tablets. Download magazines to read offline, anytime, anywhere.

Kanopy - This popular on-demand film-streaming service is now available for free at the Library. Library cardholders can access Kanopy by setting up an account using the link on our website. Films can be streamed from any computer, television, mobile device or platform by downloading the Kanopy app for iOS, Android, AppleTV, Chromecast or Roku media players.

Live-brary Downloads - Using Libby, Overdrive, or One Click Digital, download eBooks and audiobooks to your device of choice. The latest fiction, nonfiction, cookbooks, kid's books and even the Great Courses are available with your library card.



Non-traditional Items - Did you know that you can check out cookie cutters, a badminton set, cake pans, a bocce ball set, or some fun sprinklers from the Library?

Homework Help - Brainfuse offers live, on-demand online tutoring for students in grades four through college. Members can get instant academic assistance from expert tutors throughout the week.

Pronunciator - Learn a new language with Pronunciator, an interactive language learning database **pronunciator:** that provides step-by-step lesson plans for 80 different languages.

Ancestry - Ancestry Library Edition can be used on the library computers to access billions of records from North America, the UK, Europe, and more. Research your family roots using censuses, vital records, immigration records, family histories, photos, maps, and many other resources.

Monthly Craft Workshops - Each month we hold an adult craft class on a Saturday afternoon. From making a book, to painting, to holiday crafts, there is something to spark your creativity. The classes are either free or subject to a minimal materials fee.

Free Museum Passes - We currently offer free passes for the Museum of Natural History in NYC, the Parrish Art Museum, The South Fork Natural History Museum, and the Children's Museum of the East End. In the summer, we offer a pass to Harbes Family Farm.



In 2019, we hope to be able to add to this list by offering some basic computer classes and other educational opportunities. If you have any questions or need some help to take advantage of these resources, please ask at the desk and one of the friendly staff will make sure you receive assistance.


Meet Audiobook Narrator Gerard Doyle

Dickens' last novel about the corrupting influence of money, is a biting satire of social analysis. Harmon dies and leaves the dust heap operation to his estranged son John on the condition that he marry Bella Wilfer, a young woman unknown

to John. The savage economic inequality of 1860s London provides the backdrop to one of Dickens' most sophisticated works.
