CELEBRATING SUSTAINABILITY

As the spring brings green grass and leafy trees, we are reminded of the beauty of Shelter Island and how lucky we are to live and work in such a special place. In order to maintain the natural resources that surround us, it is important to use those resources thoughtfully and wisely. The Library has recently enrolled in The New York Library Association's Sustainability Initiative. SEED LIBRARY

The Shelter Island Seed Library, a joint project of the Library and The Sylvester Manor Educational Farm, is entering its fourth year. For those not familiar with the Seed Library, it's a collection of open-pollinated and heirloom seeds that may be "borrowed" with your library card to plant and grow at home. We hope that patrons will return seeds to the library at the end of the growing season to share with other gardeners, but returning seeds is not a requirement. 
