



Jeffrey Sussman: Boxing and the Mob: The Notorious History of the Sweet Science



Mr. Sussman's book is a fascinating contribution to American sports history.

Folk rock legends Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young had a short-lived but brilliant existence as a quartet. Renowned music and entertainment journalist David Browne did extensive archival research as well as new interviews with band members and their circles to chronicle the bands' beginnings, the genius that each member contributed, and the ego-driven feuds that split them up. Mr. Browne will talk about this fast-paced and comprehensive history of the group that produced classics such as Suite: Judy Blue Eyes, Ohio and many more.




#### INTERCAMBIO
