# **GREEN BUSINESS PARTNERSHIP CERTIFICATION**



We are proud to announce that we received Green Business Partnership Certification at the end of January. According to Dani Glaser, Program Director for the Green Business Partnership, "By becoming a certified green business, Shelter Island Public Library is modeling best green business practices and a commitment to continuous improvement." As part of this process, the library has

made a number of adjustments in our operation. We no longer purchase single use water bottles or Keurig pods. Paper usage, cleaning products and energy consumption have all been examined and changes have been made. The library has presented "green" programming around topics of interest such as the seed library and replacement of aging septic tanks.

The next step will be certification as a Sustainable Library through the New York Library Association. This program builds on the Green Business Partnership certification by focusing on the library's leadership in environmental stewardship, social equity and economic feasibility for the community.

#### **INTERCAMBIO**


#### Saturday, March 28th, 10:00 to 11:30am

#### SHAKESPEARE IN COMMUNITY: ANTONY AND CLEOPATRA Saturday, March 21st, 12:30pm



#### SHELTER ISLAND LIBRARY BOOK CLUB

A Single Thread by Tracy Chevalier: Tuesday, March 10th, 5:00pm Violet Speedwell is grieving the loss of her beloved brother and her fiancée in the First World War She is one of a generation of "surplus women" who have to make new lives for themselves at a time when there were rigid expectations for unmarried women. Escaping her repressive home, Violet becomes a "broderer", embroidering kneeling cushions for the magnificent Winchester Cathedral. A Single Thread is an engrossing depiction of a

women learning to stand up for herself against prejudice and condescension.

### MYSTERY MONDAY BOOK CLUB

Haunted Ground by Erin Hart: Monday, March 30th, 5:00pm

In a remote part of Galway, farmers cutting turf in a peat bog make a grisly discovery: the perfectly preserved head of a young woman with red hair. Peat bogs prevent decay, meaning the date of the crime may have been years or centuries ago. Irish archaeologist Cormac Maguire teams up with American pathologist Nora Gavin to solve this puzzle and to explore a possible shocking connection to the present. Haunted Ground is an atmospheric blend of forensics, history, anthropology and suspense.
