DEBORAH BURNS: SATURDAY'S CHILD: A DAUGHTER'S MEMOIR

Friday, October 16th, 7:00pm

An only child, Deborah Burns grew up in 1950s America in the shadow of her beautiful, rule-breaking mother, Dorothy – a red-haired beauty who skirted norms with style and flair. Dorothy eschewed motherhood and domesticity, turning Deborah over to her spinster aunts to raise. Deborah revered her charismatic mother, but Dorothy was a woman full of secrets with a troubled past. Saturday's Child tells the story of Deborah's eccentric upbringing and her quest, in midlife, to uncover the truth about her mother. SUSAN SCHROTT: CREATING LOVE FROM DESPAIR - THE TREE OF LIFE FOR PITTSBURGH SYNAGOGUE

In response to the anguish and shock she felt after the Pittsburgh Synagogue shooting in 2018, Textile Artist and Psychotherapist Susan Schrott decided there was something she could do. With the help of many members of the Shelter Island community, including students, she created a Tree of Life quilt filled with messages of love and compassion for the congregants, families and members of the Tree of Life Synagogue. Ms. Schrott will share her experience of this project which brought out the best in the Shelter Island Community, and which she calls, "the most meaningful piece of art I have ever created."

EDITH WHARTON BOOK CLUB


Old New York, Saturday, October 24th, 2:00pm


ADULT CRAFT - BOOK PAGE FALL BANNERS: Saturday, October 17th
