THE TRUE STORY OF THE CULPER SPY RING: Tuesday, May 11th, 7:00pm

History buffs have long been fascinated by the operation of the Long Island-based Culper Spy Ring during the American Revolution (especially since the airing of the AMC series "Turn"). Over the years, there have been many legends and suppositions about how the spies operated to support George Washington's Continental Army. This lecture separates fact from fiction and details the ingenious operation of the intelligence network that helped the revolutionaries win the war. Join Historian Bill Bleyer for this fascinating history talk.

VIRTUAL WINE TASTING WITH SUHRU WINES: Saturday, May 15th, 3:30pm

During this hour-long event, an expert from Suhru Wines in Cutchogue, will take us through their history and WINES winemaking philosophy, detailing the winemaking process for red and white wines. We'll then have a guided tasting of two wines (one red, one white), along with questions and answers. Suhru will make the wines available for purchase for \$40 (a 2019 Pinot Grigio and their 2018 Ember) at the library. Enrollment is limited, so please sign up early.

Made from the dried and ground berries of the wild sumac flower, sumac is a tangy spice with a sour, acidic flavor reminiscent of lemon juice. This simple yogurt/sumac sauce is easy to make and pairs deliciously with roasted vegetables.

Phineas Finn: Saturday, May 22nd, 2:00pm



Robicheaux by James Lee Burke: Monday, May 24th, 5:00pm



As he works to clear his name, he encounters a cast of characters and a resurgence of dark social forces that threaten to destroy all those he loves.

In Shakespeare's history play, *Richard II*, anger at a king's arbitrary rule leads to his downfall and sets in motion a decades-long struggle for the crown. It is the first part of a tetralogy, referred to by some scholars as the Henriad, followed by three plays about Richard's successors: Henry IV, Part 1; Henry IV, Part 2; and Henry V.
