

FRIDAY NIGHT DIALOGUES

LEAH FRIEDMAN AND PETER WALDNER: I'M 91 YEARS OLD...WHAT DO YOU WANT FROM ME?

Peter Waldner will be talking with local playwright and artist Leah Friedman about her work and life. Leah is an artist who is led by her hand and her heart and inspired by her childhood memories and the Holocaust. She is a writer and creates art in many different mediums, including acrylic on canvas.


HEATHER REYLEK: Friday, October 14th, 7:00pm

Heather Reylek, songwriter, vocalist, and local musician will be performing her original songs along with an inside view of the song writing process. She will share a generous mix of what makes up her recent repertoire. There's always a strong folk traditional influence that stretches back to her many years singing with Homespun which later evolved into Island Folk. Some songs are old timey blues inspired by 1920's black vocalists. Other songs are hard to define because they seem to come from centuries past. Some are drawing on a love for old style country music and her favorite songwriter, the late John Prine. Edgy songs, sad songs, the creative process keeps rolling.

RAYMOND DOWD: "TALES FROM THE TEMPLE OF ISHTAR": Friday, October 21st, 7:00pm

Dowd will lecture on Dunnington's landmark 2013 NY Court of Appeals victory in Matter of Flamenbaum for a German museum seeking to recover a golden Assyrian tablet. The Assyrian tablet surfaced in 2003 in the Nassau County safe deposit box of a deceased man. Flamenbaum is a landmark case which clearly rejected the spoils of war doctrine and reaffirmed the common law rule that no one can take good title to property from a thief. Raymond Dowd, who argued the case before the New York Court of Appeals will discuss the historical importance of the Flamenbaum gold tablet, its beauty and provenance, as well as the significance of court rulings in determining ownership of this highly contested artifact.

KNITTING AND CROCHET WITH ASHLEY: Monday, October 17th, 5:30pm





SHELTER ISLAND BOOK CLUB: The Daughters Of Yalta: The Churchills, Roosevelts, and Harrimans:

A Story of Love and War by Catherine Grace Katz: Tuesday, October 18th, 5:00pm 🏠

The Shelter Island Book Club, led by Suzanne Louer, reads works of fiction and nonfiction with an emphasis on well-regarded contemporary fiction. Three bright, glamorous young women accompanied their renowned fathers to the February, 1945 conference. The story of the tensions at Yalta and their effect on the wartime alliance of Franklin Roosevelt, Winston Churchill and Joseph Stalin are explored through the three young women. Family loyalty, political savvy and romances played a part in this world-changing event.
