Recently we got some new filament (including glow-in-the-dark) so we're happy to print all kinds of models in a variety of colors. Interested in coding? We have amazing BitsBox volumes that can be checked out. They are a great way to understand different coding basics and new ways to utilize different lines of code. Our VR system is completely wireless and brand new (Thanks Friends of the Library!) It's available for all ages to try so if you're interested in the world of Virtual Reality, come visit us and learn all about it. We also have backpacks available for check out that are based on magnets, magnification, and gravity-an awesome way to learn these concepts at a beginner level. SHELTER ISLAND BOOK CLUB: The Burgess Boys by Elizabeth Strout

KNITTING CLUB: Thursdays, January 5th, 12th, 19th and 26th, 4:30pm 👚


Our weekly Knitting Club is meeting at the big table upstairs in the library. Whether you are a long-time member or newly interested in knitting, we look forward to seeing you there!
