

### LIBRARY HISTORY

By the early 1960s the Island's population had grown to more than a thousand residents and our library had outgrown the small building near the school. The Tuthill family donated the lot where the present building stands today, almost across the street from the original library home in the "Old Store." With the help of the Lion's Club, the community came out to support the construction of a new larger library with space for children and adults. On August 14,1965, the new library, designed by Milton C. Sherman, was dedicated. The President of the Trustees on that date was Andrew Fiske, great-nephew of the first President, Cornelia Horsford.



### LIBRARY PROGRAMS

### **BOOK CLUBS** SHELTER ISLAND BOOK CLUB: Autumn by Ali Smith

Tuesday, March 14th, 5:00pm 🕋

The Shelter Island Book Club, led by Suzanne Louer, reads works of fiction and nonfiction with an emphasis on well-regarded contemporary fiction. Autumn is a post-Brexit novel of love, truth, and time in which Elisabeth Demand reflects on her almost lifelong romantic-spiritual love affair with 101-year-old Daniel Gluck. As the novel gets under way, the narrator describes an England in 2016 that is experiencing the worst of times. The meaning of time, aging and the nature of stories is explored in this first novel in a highly anticipated quartet.

The Mystery Book Club run by Jessica Montgomery and Jocelyn Ozolins reads everything from classic mysteries to thrillers. Brilliant cop Cody Hoyt is an alcoholic struggling with sobriety when his mentor and AA sponsor Hank Winters is found burned to death in a remote mountain cabin. Despite the clues that make it look like suicide, Cody knows Hank would never kill himself. When items found at the scene link the murderer to an outfitter leading tourists on a wilderness horseback trip into the remote corners of Yellowstone National Park, Cody is desperate to get on their trail and stop the killer before the group heads into the wild.

### SHAKESPEARE IN COMMUNITY ONLINE: TWO GENTLEMEN OF VERONA

In this Shakespeare Comedy, the two "gentlemen", Proteus and Valentine, are taking leave of one another as the play opens. The play deals with the themes of friendship and infidelity, the conflict between friendship and love, and the foolish behavior of people in love.


### ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL) CONVERSATION


### Saturdays, March 4th, 18th and 25th, 3:30pm 🌪
