WHAT'S UP WITH THE KIDS?

These days our Youth Services area is bustling with kids of all ages. "Youth Services" means we serve ages 0 all the way to 18 years old. While we love and encourage our readers, the library has become so much more for our young patrons than a place to read. On average we offer one to three programs every day throughout the week for our young patrons. Our tweens and teens utilize the library as a place to socialize, play tabletop games with each other, work on homework, and participate in programs such as our Graphic Novel Book Club, slime parties, movie nights, pop-up crafts and other awesome events. Meanwhile, our younger patrons are often challenging each other on the Nintendo Switch, creating yarn bracelets, designing and making buttons, decorating treasure boxes, making maps, and more. And our littlest ones participate in sensory hour, story time, and crafts such as finger painting, paper plate dinosaurs, cardboard space shuttle creation, and other fun projects. All of these programs give children of all ages a chance to socialize and try something new while also allowing their caregivers a chance to chat with other adults or participate in a fun craft. We believe that our library staff has created a safe, welcoming environment for our kids to have a place to express themselves and their creativity.

Bliss Morehead was relentless in pursuit of the perfect word or phrase and thought poets would "likely spend the rest of our lives trying to make it better and never be satisfied." The Bliss Morehead Poetry Grant was established in 2021 by Shelter Islander Mike Zisser in memory of his wife Bliss Morehead Zisser, who for a decade, curated poetry readings at the Library each April in honor of Poetry Month. We continue this tradition in her honor with a reading of some of her favorite poets on the theme of "Past and Future". GOOGLE SHEETS WITH DEBBIE DITMER: Monday, April 3rd, 6:00pm 💿

Four months after the Battle of Gettysburg, President Abraham Lincoln traveled to Gettysburg to help dedicate a cemetery for the fallen United States soldiers. His "few appropriate remarks," only ten sentences in length and delivered in less than three minutes, have since become some of the most famous words ever spoken in American History. Join Gettysburg NMP Park Ranger John Hoptak for an examination of the aftermath of the three-day battle of Gettysburg, the creation of the Soldiers' National Cemetery, and the meaning and continuing relevance of Lincoln's "Gettysburg Address."

LEISURAMA OF MONTAUK: ONLY IN AMERICA: A PODCAST AND DISCUSSION WITH OUR HAMPTONS PODCAST COHOSTS ESPERANZA LEON AND IRWIN LEVY: Tuesday, April 18th, 1:00pm 📼

Leisurama was a line of inexpensive prefabricated houses sold through Macy's department stores in the mid-1960s, and featured at the 1959 American National Exhibition in Moscow. Some of the houses were built in Culloden Point in Montauk, where some still remain. We'll listen to the podcast, and hear from the co-hosts for a lively discussion about this uniquely American phenomenon that proves there is truly no place like home.


KNITTING AND CROCHET WITH ASHLEY

SHELTER ISLAND BOOK CLUB: A Speck in the Sea: A Story of Survival and Rescue by John Aldridge and Anthony Sosinski: Tuesday, April 11th, 4:30pm 🕋
