
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FROM THE DIRECTOR


TAI CHI WITH DENISE GILLIES: Wednesdays, September 6th & 20th, 5:00pm

It's the perfect time of year for some fun and easy crafts. Your kits will provide you with the tools and instructions to create your own uniquely designed fall themed coasters!


