This year, that work expanded to include eelarass plantings and the creation of an oyster reef by adding Shelter Island to the network of Back to the Bays Stewardship Sites. Meet Islander Kate Rossi-Snook of CCE Marine and learn about shellfish aquaculture for restoration, the importance of oyster reefs and eelgrass meadows, and the broader ecological and cultural value of living shorelines.




